# LCI EMPLOYEES OFFER INNOVATIVE IDEAS

The top three winners of the International Headquarters Innovation Contest were announced at the President's Luncheon on Monday, May 10. The contest was the idea of President Lee, who was looking for creative and fresh ideas from Lions Clubs International staff that would help them better serve Lions members.

"For many years, we have discussed the idea of having a central Publications Department," said **Joyce Truby**, Public Relations, who placed third in the contest. "The 'we' refers to anyone who gets phone and/or e-mail requests for publications. The biggest problem is that many times a Lion will want material from several departments and therefore has to be transferred around the building. Departments that are close to each other try to coordinate these requests so that a Lion is not receiving several packages - this

also saves on postage costs. If there were one phone number to call to order publications, this would eliminate the need for all this transferring and would save the association on postage costs."

**Mindy Marks**, New Clubs and Marketing, was the second place winner in the contest with her suggestion to create a user manual that would help staff utilize the CGI system.

"The new system allows much greater access to information. People can find record histories, search for members based on their names, develop views to find data, etc.," said Marks. "We would all benefit from learning how we can use the system to help us every day."

First place winner **Joshua Friedman**, LCIF Sight Programs, came up with an idea that has already been reworked and implemented.

"My idea was to be able to track our vacation, comp and sick time on the intranet," said Friedman. "My suggestion was then tweaked

to include the number of our remaining vacation hours on our pay stubs."

Although there were only three winners announced, all submitted ideas have been read and considered. Several employees participated in this contest, allowing their voices to be heard.

"This contest was a very interesting and innovative idea on International President Lee's part," said Truby. "I was happy just to share this idea."
