Did you know that Lions Clubs International headquarters has an intranet website? Since January 2000 this site has been available to all LCI employees, providing various content information for the association.

To access the intranet, type "intranet" in the address line of Internet Explorer and click on "Go" or press "Enter." The intranet home page will be displayed with links to various pages of information. If you would like to see a list of what is available on the site, click on the Site Map link, which is located at the bottom of the menu list. From the Site Map listing you can click on the page you would like to view. Examples of available information are the newly updated publications list, the employee handbook, the office directory, the routing guide and archived and current issues of The Insider (December 2000 to the present).

HEALTH SPOT: AVOIDING BLOOD (LOTS


A recent report released by the European Respiratory Journal warns computer users that they may be at a higher risk of developing blood clots. The same type of blood clots that are found to develop in long haul airline passengers may also occur in men and women who spend many hours in front of a computer. This report comes after a 32-year-old man, who often spent prolonged amounts of time in front of his computer (up to twelve hours) and went hours without standing, began suffering the effects of venous thromboembolism, a condition in which blood clots develop in immobile limbs and then travel to the lungs. The study suggests that people who spend prolonged amounts of time in front of a computer should exercise their feet and legs and take breaks away from their computers.

4 ounces cheddar cheese shredded
