

CAMPAIGN SIGHTFIRST II KICKS-OFF



ur office has picked up some new energy, new faces and a new purpose in recent weeks. The board approved Campaign SightFirst II in October, and LCIF is gearing up for a \$150 million campaign to prevent blindness and restore vision for millions.

The campaign officially kicks-off at the international convention in Hong Kong and will culminate in 2007-08. Immediate Past International President Dr. Tae-Sup Lee has been appointed as International Chairperson of the International Committee for Campaign SightFirst II and Past International President J. Frank Moore III is serving as the International Vice Chairperson and Coordinator. An International Committee has also been appointed with representatives from each constitutional area, with an additional member for the OSEAL and United States areas.

The campaign's goal is to reduce blindness in both developing and developed countries. Age-old scourges to sight such as cataracts, trachoma and river blindness will be eliminated as public health concerns. Relatively new threats to sight such as diabetic eye disease, macular degeneration and childhood blindness will be stopped in their tracks.

SightFirst has been an extraordinary success. In just a decade and a half, Lions have restored sight to 4.6 million people through cataract surgeries and prevented serious vision loss in another 20 million. Moreover, Lions have improved eye care services for hundreds of millions.

However, the rapid increase in life expectancy and growing threats to sight, such as diabetes, threaten millions with loss of vision. Unless action is taken now, the number of blind people could double to a staggering 75 million by 2020.

Coordinating the campaign will be Community Counselling Service (CCS), the fundraising-consulting firm

that ran the first Campaign SightFirst. About eight CCS staff members will eventually be located in our office in the northeast corner of the second floor. Two CCS staff

northeast corner of the second floor. Two CCS staff members, Lily Ayala Berlyn and Kevin Cherep, are already here and **Cindy Meyer** has joined the campaign team.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

CANDY CANE COOKIES

3/4 cup butter (softened)

1/2 cup sugar

1 tsp baking powder

1 egg

1/2 tsp peppermint extract

1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour

6 oz white chocolate baking squares

1 tbsp shortening

1/3 cup finely crushed striped round peppermint candies

- Preheat oven to 375.
- In a large mixing bowl, mix butter until soft. Mix in sugar and baking powder. Mix in egg and peppermint extract. Lastly, mix in flour.
- Force dough through cookie press with 1/2 inch plate into candy cane shapes on an ungreased cookie sheet.
- Bake cookies for 8 minutes or until edges are firm. Remove cookies from pan and let cool.
- In a small saucepan over low heat, melt white chocolate with shortening Stir frequently. Dip one end of each cookie into the chocolate and let excess drip off. Place cookies on wax paper and sprinkle with crushed peppermint candies.
